





Local History Walk with Martha Gunn, 90mins Brighton Museum, £4.50 per child

Come and listen to Martha's tales about Brighthelmstone as a fishing town, her life as a dipper and the arrival of our most famous resident - the King of England, George IV. Martha will show the class her collection of paintings and maps, before taking them on a 50 minutes walk around the Royal Pavilion Estate and the Lanes to find out more about the history of the town.

- 3. Make links with people in the past
- 4. Recognise how buildings and features in their local area have changed over time
- 5. Understand some of the main events and people linked to their city
- 6. Get some fresh air and exercise

History Curriculum Links

- a study over time tracing how several aspects of national history are reflected in the locality (this can go beyond 1066)
- a study of an aspect of history or a site dating from a period beyond 1066 that is significant in the locality
- significant historical events, people and places in their own locality
