Meet Minnie Turner and learn what life was like in Brighton at the turn of the 20th century when women were fighting for the right to vote. What were her motivations, beliefs and values?

3. To find out more about the effects of the women's suffrage campaign on life today.
4. To encourage empathy and understanding for people's motivations in the past, and to reflect on our own lives
5. To discuss active citizenship
